Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O Lord, faithful God.	I can ask God questions, but it isn't my place to make demands.	<i>God, I will stop kicking at locked doors and trust that you are for me.</i>
<i>Lesson 3: Role Playing</i>		
Ephesians 5:22–23 Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior.	If I continually take control at home, my husband probably won't fight me for the reins.	<i>God, I will give you control of my marriage by inviting my husband to lead.</i>
<i>Lesson 4: Cursed with a Craving</i>		
Romans 8:20–21 For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God.	I am infected with a desire for control that leads to misery, not happiness.	<i>God, please reverse the curse of control in my heart and in my relationships. I surrender to your work in my life.</i>
